

To the parents of children in Year 4,

I am a Senior Lecturer in Education at the University of Winchester; prior to this I was Deputy Head at Swanmore Primary for 12 years (1994-2006). In connection with my work in Initial Teacher Training and as a Royal Geographical Society Fellow I am interested in the learning and teaching of Primary Geography.

During the Spring Term I am hoping to work with a colleague Dr Helen Clarke to plan a research project called 'Stories of the woods.' It is part of an ongoing investigation into children's relationships with the natural world and explores links between geography, science, English and other curriculum subjects. Our study seeks to develop children's exploration and understanding of woodland environments. The children will have the opportunity to participate in a range of experiential woodland activities using a variety of creative and active teaching and learning strategies, which we hope will be motivating, thought provoking and enjoyable.

As part of this project we aim to collect the children's ideas and actions through audio recording, photographs, drawings and written observations in the field. With permission, some of this data may be used within University sessions to share with our students, at research conferences to share practice or within academic and professional publications to explore theoretical and practical aspects of teaching and learning in geography. We will also provide copies for the school as evidence of the learning undertaken.

The students have undergone DBS enhanced clearance. Once we have collected this data all reference to individual children and the school will be erased to ensure confidentiality. No real names of children will be included in any articles that we write. You have the right to see the outcomes of the research that involves your child specifically. With your permission, we would like to take photographs of the children at work; these photographs will be kept securely in a password protected computer and only used for the purpose of sharing research within the educational community.
