Year 1 Spring Term

Maths

This term your child will be building on their knowledge and understanding of number.

They will be developing their understanding of addition and subtraction.

Emphasis will be placed on solving real life situations including money, time and measurement.

Science

Animals

This term we will be learning about and identifying both common animals found in England and African animals. We will be looking at different animals and grouping them and look at facts such as: herbivores, carnivores or omnivores.

What a Sensation!

We will be learning about our five senses - Sight, Taste, Touch, Hearing and Smell.

The children will study the importance of the senses in their everyday lives.

English

Through their topic on 'African Animals' and 'The Senses' the children will develop their research and poetry writing skills.

They will focus on non-fiction and create their own factual booklets.

They will be expected to use their knowledge of phonics to inform their spelling and to begin to use the correct punctuation when writing.

Rainbow Readers and Read Write Inc phonics sessions will continue on a daily basis.

Handwriting lessons will begin to introduce cursive letters.

History

Geography

In Geography we will be using maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied in this key stage. The children will be comparing geographical similarities and differences of a small area of the UK and that of Kenya. They will also continue to monitor seasonal and daily weather patterns.

Art



Through our work on Africa the children will be introduced to Tinga Tinga art. This will lead to producing their own artwork in this style.

They will also study the work of Kandinsky.

PDL

Alongside the work on food hygiene children will learn the importance of healthy lifestyle.

Your child will think about the responsibilities of life in school such as looking after the school and it's grounds.

PE

In outdoor P.E. your child will be developing their ball skills in Tennis.

During indoor PE, the children will be using the apparatus in gymnastics.

They will also be working on their agility, balance and coordination through our new 'REAL PE' programme.
