Summary of PPG spending 2014/15

Objectives in spending PPG:

- employing specialist PE teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE
- providing cover staff to release teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- procuring quality-assured professional training for staff to raise their confidence and competence in teaching PE and sport
- providing training and payment for midday supervisors to introduce playground games at breaks and lunchtimes
- paying for transport, pool hire and instruction to provide additional swimming lessons for those pupils unable to swim by the end of Year 6 and to all Year 3 pupils whatever their level of ability
- establishing a house system to enable regular, inter-house sports competitions for pupils of all ages

Nature of Support:

- Financial support for identified sporting activities
- Pyramid networking support
- Provision of sporting events
- Planning and professional development opportunities

Raise the engagement and motivation levels for pupils in PE sessions. To increase staff knowledge, skills and understanding of the various elements of the PE curriculum. Teaching staff will utilise the skills and knowledge acquired from working with the coach to confidently deliver the remaining PE units across the year.	New Schemes of work introduced. Positive reaction from staff - no additional training given by outside agencies but advice provided where necessary by PE manager (LH). Many staff felt the scheme of work was sufficient and no additional costs needed for CPD. Instead the funding originally allocated for staff CPD was used to develop a new Athletics scheme of work for KS2 which was trialled in Summer 2015 - initial feedback was very positive
