Summary of spending 2019/20

Objectives in spending PE & Sports Premium Grant:

- paying for transport, pool hire and instruction to provide additional swimming lessons for those pupils unable to swim by the end of Year 6 and to all Year 3 pupils whatever their level of ability
- support a mini bus lease to enable identified children to participate in additional activities
- providing cover staff to release teachers for professional development/planning for sport
- to facilitate the hosting and organising of intra-school sporting events and interschool events with local and district schools
- to provide adequate and skill appropriate sporting equipment.
- to provide pupils access to sporting activities outside of school hours.
- to support provision of enhanced opportunities for lunches/play to support healthy lifestyles

Nature of Support:

- Pyramid networking support
- Provision of sporting events
- Targeting support to increase activity for Pupil Premium PP children and those with limited access to clubs/provision
- Improved lunch opportunities
