





	<p>Anderson, Laura – I Don't Want Curly Hair A girl with unruly curls yearns for straight hair but sees her tresses in a new light when she meets a girl who would love to swap her boring straight hair for curls. A story about accepting who we are that is especially useful for KSI PHSE.</p>	Y
	<p>Barker, Claire – Best Friends Forever The ghost of a beloved pet dog enlists the help of other ghost animals to help save his family's home when they are forced to sell their house. Good animal characterisation makes this first book in the series an enjoyable read.</p>	CF
	<p>Barton, Suzanne – Robin's Winter Song A story about the arrival of winter that incorporates plenty of facts about the changing season. Robin watches the bears getting ready to hibernate and squirrels storing food in this wonderful story ideal for KSI.</p>	Y
	<p>Bunzl, P – Moonlocket Set in Victorian London, Lily and her friend Robert must stop a master thief after he escapes from prison. This second book in the series sees Lily, Robert and Malkin the mechanical fox, set out on an adventure full of danger, daring, family secrets and long-buried treasure. Well written and with good character development, this is an excellent read for upper KS2.</p>	CF
	<p>Butchart, Pamela – There's a Werewolf in my Tent! In this sixth title of the series, the class are on a school trip and believe one of their teachers has become a werewolf. A hilarious school story with likeable characters is ideal for lower KS2.</p>	CF

	<p>Butler, Heather – The Milkshake Detectives Charlie and Julia are certain that the sleepy village of Peddle-Worth must contain some mysteries for their brand new agency - The Milkshake Detectives - to solve. All they need to do is find them! An engaging story of friendship with well written characters that is suitable for lower KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Caldecott, Elen – Dogs and Doctors In this fifth book of the series, the gang get together to solve the mystery of Barry, the therapy dog, who goes missing whilst one of the gang is in hospital. A well written mystery for Upper KS2 and good for fans of the series.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Clark, Emma Chickster – Plenty of Love to go Around A wonderful warm-hearted read in which the endearing Plum has to deal with the arrival of a new pet cat. The story has lots of relevance for real life situations focussing on how to deal with feelings of jealousy. Good for KS1/lower KS2.</p>	<p>Y</p>
	<p>Corderoy, Tracey – The Very Messy Mermaid A little mermaid wishes that her ultra-neat parents would allow her to have a messy birthday party. Thanks to her fairy godmother, her wish comes true. A lovely story for sharing at KS1.</p>	<p>Y</p>
	<p>Cotterill, Jo - Electrigril and the Invisible Thieves This is the third book in the Electrigril series and Holly must stop evil genius Macavity's latest scheme despite having trouble with her super powers. A pacy adventure that combines humour and comic book illustration to tell the story.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>De La Mare, Walter – Silver An illustrated picture book edition of de la Mare's poem about two children who have a night-time adventure with fairies by the light of the full moon. Useful for English at KS1.</p>	<p>Y</p>

	<p>Haworth, Katie – Petunia Paris’s Parrot Petunia is a girl who has everything, but when she requests a parrot for her birthday she learns that getting everything you want is not necessarily a good thing. An engaging read for upper KS1/lower KS2.</p>	<p>Y</p>
	<p>Hitchcock, Fleur – Murder in Midwinter Thirteen year old Maya takes a photograph and unwittingly records a crime which puts her life and her family at risk. Convinced she is a vital witness to a crime, the police send Emma into hiding in rural Wales. An adventure story with plenty of mystery that is good for Year 6.</p>	<p>T</p>
	<p>Jay, Alison – Bee & Me A wordless picture book that highlights the plight of the disappearing Bumble Bee. The story shows how a little girl makes friends with a bee and helps to fill her city home with flowers for the insects. Lovely to discuss and share at KS1.</p>	<p>Y</p>
	<p>Jones, Pip – Big County Fair In this next book of the series, Ava enters Squishy McFluff, her invisible cat, into a pet competition at the annual country fair where it is left to the duo to foil a robbery! This gentle rhyming story is perfect for young readers to develop confidence.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Kessler, Liz – Has Anyone Seen Jessica Jenkins? Jessica Jenkins has always thought she was a perfectly ordinary girl, until the day that part of her arm vanishes in the middle of a Geography lesson. A science fiction adventure from a well established author that is good for upper KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Martin, Laura – Edge of Extinction Set in a dystopian world where dinosaurs rule the earth and humans are forced to live underground, but all may not be as it seems. A fast moving adventure with plenty of suspense that will have universal appeal at upper KS2. First book in a new series.</p>	<p>CF</p>

	<p>McKay, Hilary – Binny Bewitched</p> <p>A warm, engaging story dealing with plenty of humour and drama. In this third book of the series, Binny Cornwallis has lost money. Money that wasn't really hers in the first place. With her best enemy Gareth and her beloved dog Max she turns detective to track it down. Good for series fans and suitable for Year 6.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>McLelland, K – Blackbird, Blackbird, What do you do?</p> <p>A young blackbird questions other birds about their special talents whilst searching for his own. Good for sharing and topic support at KS1.</p>	<p>Y</p>
	<p>Muncaster, Harriet – Isadora Moon Gets in Trouble</p> <p>This fifth book in the series sees Isadora bring a dragon to school for pet day, but looking after a dragon turns out to be a little bit harder than she expects. A fun plot with plenty of mischief to engage young readers at upper KS1/lower KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Peters, Helen – A Piglet Called Truffle</p> <p>A young girl secretly saves a tiny runt piglet on her family's farm but has to persuade her parents not to sell Truffle for market once she has grown. First book in a new series for lower KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Reeve, Philip – Jinks & O'Hare Funfair Repair</p> <p>An energetic, wacky and fun space adventure that follows the adventures of a girl who lives on a funfair planet in outer space, where a mystery villain seems to be sabotaging the rides. A good stand alone fiction for KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Riddell, Chris – Ottoline and the Purple Fox</p> <p>The fourth book in the Ottoline series takes Ottoline on a night time adventure where she meets a fox who takes her on a nocturnal tour of the city. But who is the poet sticking anonymous notes to the lampposts? A lovely continuation to this humorous series for KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>

	<p>Vulliamy, Clara – The Midnight Mystery</p> <p>This is the third title in a series that is good for building confidence in young fiction readers. Dot is busy investigating strange events at an outdoor adventure camp whilst her dog McClusky, is left at home to train for the local dog show. Good for KS1/lower KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>
	<p>Vulliamy, Clara – The Not-a-Pig</p> <p>This series follows the adventures of a little girl and her pet tapir. These well written short stories focus on friendship and work well at lower KS2.</p>	<p>CF</p>
